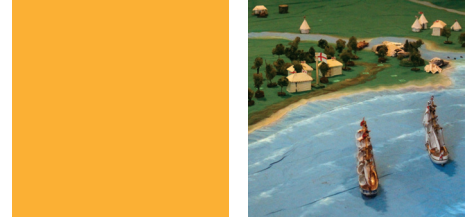


# HOBART TOWN



An interactive program exploring why the British chose Sullivans Cove over 200 years ago as the ideal place for establishing a colony.

Using a huge floor map of Sullivans Cove, students will consider Hobart's origins and the effect European arrival had on the local Mouheneener people. Students will set up camp and commence building a model Hobart Town.

Students will develop their own historical skills in discovering the significance of the museum's buildings, visiting the galleries and hearing the stories the museum collections can tell.
