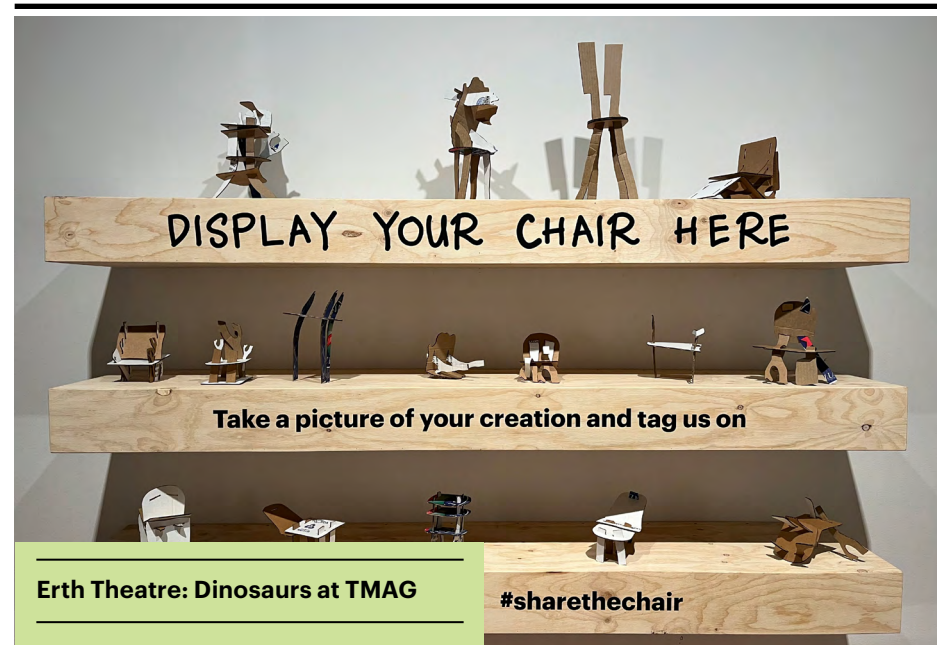
Book Making
