


### **Hobart Current: Liberty**

12 March-9 May 2021

Hobart Current: Liberty is a thought-provoking new contemporary art program and exhibition, featuring new works created by 10 artists from Tasmania, interstate and overseas in response to the theme of 'liberty'.

Tasmanian artists Sinsa Mansell, Brigita Ozolins, James Newitt, Jacob Leary, Dexter Rosengrave and Nadège Philippe-Janon alongside interstate and international talent Uncle Wes Marne, Suryo Herlambang, Jagath Dheerasekara and Sarah Jane Pell, have all created new works in the mediums of film, installation, performance and visual art.

The program begins at TMAG with an exhibition in the museum's Argyle Galleries and then continues across the city of Hobart. Two of the artists' works are on display at outdoor sites within the CBD and the city is further activated with a range of public programs exploring the 'liberty' theme.

Hobart Current is a major partnership between the City of Hobart and TMAG, supported by Events Tasmania.

#### MY VOICE

Brigita Ozolins 85 Macquarie Street



Brigita is a multimedia artist who lives in Hobart. Inspired by a passion for literature, she makes art about the links between language, history and identity.

MY VOICE is about the links between language and liberty. It has been inspired by Malala Yousafzai, a Pakistani teenager and the youngest person to ever receive a Nobel Peace Prize. Despite an attempt on her life by the Taliban, and being placed under a Fatwa, she gives voice to girls whose educational opportunities are severely limited. On 12 July 2013, at the Youth Takeover of the United Nations, Malala said: "I raise up my voice—not so that I can shout, but so that those without a voice can be heard".

During Hobart Current: Liberty, Malala's words will be seen on the façade of the office building 85 Macquarie Street, Hobart.
